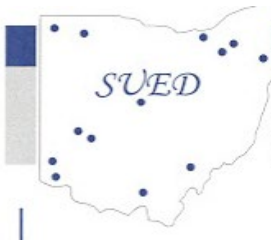

 1. Policies that enhance the professionalization of teaching through the recognition and reward of teachers as knowledgeable professionals with specialized knowledge and skills
 - b. HB 336: Reinstates JEOC
 - i. OACTE Input on Educator Preparation Program Requirements and Policies. To acknowledge the expertise of our teacher education institutions, we will advocate for:
 1. Support for feedback channels providing outward communication of proposed legislative or administrative policy changes and gathering feedback on the impact of such changes
 - c. SB 121: Adopt Health Education Standards
 - i. Stability of ODE Policies – Licensing, P-12 Curriculum and Instruction. P-12 policies sometimes have unintended consequences on teacher preparation programs. We will advocate for:
 1. Alignment of K-12 curriculum with Specialized Professional Association (SPA) content standards
